- f) That By-law Numbers 1983-46 and 93-18 be repealed and replaced with a new By-law so that the definition of "sewage" is included in the By-law as it is written in the *Municipal Act* and so that existing Sewer Surcharge Reserve Funds are available to support operation, maintenance and enhancement of the City's entire stormwater and sanitary sewage infrastructure.

T-24-15 for the Transit Terminal West Wing Renovation

Firearm - means any barrelled weapon from which any shot, bullet, missile or other projectile can be discharged and that is capable of causing bodily harm, injury or death and includes anything that can be adapted for the use as a Firearm, and for the purpose of this By-law includes an air gun, air soft gun, Bow, paint ball gun, slingshot and spring gun or any class or type thereof, and

That the definition of "Bow" exclude the words "to a person" at the end of the definition.
