Multi-Use Trails Update

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## **Purpose**

A report to provide an update on multi-use trail development projects, through a presentation by the City's Transportation Demand Planner.

## **Recommendation**

## **Budget and Financial Implications**

There are no budgetary or financial implications associated with the recommendation.

## **Background**

The City's Transportation Demand Planner will attend the March 7, 2018 meeting of the Accessibility Advisory Committee to provide an update on the City's multi-use trail system and associated projects.

The Integrated Accessibility Standards Regulation 191/11 (IASR) requires the City to consult with the Accessibility Advisory Committee on particular details of new recreational trails and exterior paths of travel, and on details of redeveloped recreational trails and exterior paths of travel. The City is required to consult on:

- a. The slope of the trail.
- b. The need for, and location of, ramps on the trail.
- c. The need for, location and design of rest areas, passing areas, viewing areas, amenities on the trail, and any other pertinent feature.
- d. The design and placement of rest areas along the exterior path of travel.

For the purpose of consultation requirements, an exterior path of travel refers to an outdoor sidewalk or walkway designed and constructed for pedestrian travel, intended to serve a functional purpose and not to provide a recreational experience.
