# Background

#### **Council for Persons with Disabilities**

The Accessibility and Communication Specialist attended the January 25, 2018 meeting of the Council for Persons with Disabilities.

## **National Accessibility Week**

Planning for the 2018 'National AccessAbility Week' events has started. The first meeting was January 18, 2018.

### Accessibility Social Media Campaign

The 2017 social media campaign was very successful, demonstrating the City's commitment to Accessibility. The campaign is now complete; however, the City's twitter account @CityPtbo will continue to promote accessibility as appropriate.

#### **Accessibility Reviews**

The best way to remove barriers is to prevent them. The Accessibility Office provides formal reviews during the planning and design stages of all City projects, including projects related to buildings, public spaces, services, documents, websites, by-laws, plans and policies. Recent reviews and research include:

- Application for Banner Installation over George Street: created an accessible fillable pdf form.
- Posters for the Community Wellbeing Plan: formatted posters for the Café Chat, Talk Over Tea and Discussion Over Dessert events in February to be accessible.
- 2018 Snofest calendar of events: formatted calendar to be accessible.
- Tree and Woodland Appeals Committee Terms of Reference: formatted document to be accessible.
- Planning Advisory Committee (PAC) Terms of Reference: formatted document to be accessible.
- 2017 Civic Awards Package: formatted the information package to be accessible and created an accessible fillable pdf nomination form.
- James Stevenson Park playground: prepared documentation to help proponents bidding on the project understand the accessibility expectations of the scope of work.
- Peterborough Public Library Assisted Listening System: reviewed user and space needs on site with an audiologist for the Multi-Purpose Room and the Community Room.

### Public Engagement

Peterborough Transit is conducting <u>public consultation</u> for the most ideal route for the Community Bus coming in March 2018. The survey was released on January 10, 2018 and closed on Friday, January 26, 2018. Feedback from this survey will inform the Transit Division on the best possible route for the Community Bus.
