Background

Staffing updates

One of our part-time library technicians submitted their resignation as they were offered a permanent position at the Lakefield Public Library. We have been able to fill the

vacancy with an internal candidate.

Joseph Fortin is the successful candidate for the temporary Assistant Clerical Supervisor position, which runs until June 30, 2017.

In February, morning all staff mini meetings were introduced. They seem to be going well thus far. Not all staff can attend, but there are short summary notes sent out via email after each meeting to all staff. General topics discussed are a catch up on housekeeping details, renovation updates, staffing news, changes to procedures, upcoming programs during the next week, community events, etc. All staff in attendance are invited to share their thoughts or any information they have that might be relevant to the library.

Collections

Hoopla has been a wonderful success thus far. The information services staff have been trained on its use and there seems to be an excellent uptake from the community.

The Collections Development Librarian has been training staff on the use of *CollectionHQ* for overall collection maintenance. Weeding processes are being streamlined and we now have much better data to work with for ordering new titles.

Trent Talk

The Acting Library Manager/CEO and the Marketing and Communications Coordinator were invited to speak with the staff at the Bata Library at Trent about our experiences with moving the library. They are also preparing for a move and a renovation and

wanted some first hand experience. It was a great opportunity for us to re-examine what went well (and what did not) before we prepare to move back to Aylmer St. The talk seemed to be well received and appreciated by the staff at Bata.

Headsets

Staff are investigating the possibility of purchasing headsets to help with communication throughout the library. There will be a lot more ground to cover in the new space and this will be a great way to enhance and improve customer service. We believe it will also assist in safety and security measures.

Library Tours

Two large ESL groups from the LINC program at Fleming came in for tours of the library. These classes have more than doubled in size in the last year, and almost everyone who was a part of the tour signed up for a library card before leaving. We were able to highlight our new Arabic collection, as well as our growing ESL section. Participants were eager to explore our online resources, particularly *Transparent Language* and *Library Press Display* which has hundreds of newspapers and magazines from countries around the world. We were also able to highlight the multilingual interface and keyboard inputs on our public internet computers.

There was also a tour for a K-1 class with 25 kids held on February 9th, 2017.
