- Ongoing consolidation of "flood-affected" glass plate negative boxes, i.e., the boxes of negatives treated at ROSCO (now called First On Site).

- Booth at Trent Central Student Association's Holiday Market (Jan. 20).
- Word on the Hill lectures of Jan. 24 and 31 sold out.
- Tender documents for Museum Public Spaces Renovation project in development; project scheduled for March 31 to June 30, 2010.
- Permanent gallery exhibition redevelopment continues; targeted completion March 31, 2010.
- Investigating proposal from Light Pollution Abatement Committee to replace existing parking lot lights with cut-off fixtures.
