A fascinating and often under appreciated piece of Canadian history, this mobile exhibition explores the temperance debate and prohibition era that affected Canadians in both the private and public spheres. It is a story of crime and smuggling, of action and danger, of humour and morality.

Show Components: eight bifold panels (6'x7'), two single panels and one trifold panel (9'x7') with text and images designed for comfortable viewing. Four plexiglas cases for display of artifacts (3 of which are mounted on display panels) and one stand-alone case containing a ship model (fully assembled). Two life-size cut-out figures. Audio CD and educational programming also included.
