Turnbull Plaque Cost Sharing

PURPOSE

A report to request that the PACAC cover half the cost of the bronze plaque produced to commemorate the Turnbull Disaster and restoration of the current building by Seven Hills Developments Inc.

RECOMMENDATION

That the Peterborough Architectural Conservation Advisory Committee approve the recommendation outlined in Report PACAC11-020 dated September 13, 2011, of the Heritage Resources Coordinator as follows:

That the Committee contribute funds to cover half the cost of the Turnbull Plaque for a total of \$621.09.

BUDGET AND FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

A cost of \$621.09 to the Committee will result from the approval of the recommendation of Report PACAC11-020. The funds are available in the Special Project reserve account which has a current balance of \$17,707.80.

BACKGROUND

In March of 2010, the PACAC approved a report recommending that the PACAC enter into negotiations with Seven Hills Developments, Inc. and the Peterborough Historical Society to create a bronze plaque commemorating the Turnbull Disaster. The Peterborough Historical Society expressed an interest in being involved in the project but was unable to contribute financially. The PHS has contributed in kind by writing the interpretive text for the plaque. The plaque is now complete and arrangements are being made for a dedication ceremony and installation. The total cost of the plaque is \$1242.18 which the PACAC is being asked to share evenly with Seven Hill Development Corporation, the owners of the building on the Turnbull Department Store site.
