SUBJECT: Report PACAC11-022

Purchase of Outstanding Heritage Designation Plaques

PURPOSE

A report to request that the PACAC purchase the remaining outstanding Heritage Designation plaques.

RECOMMENDATION

That the Peterborough Architectural Conservation Advisory Committee approve the recommendation outlined in Report PACAC11-022 dated October 12, 2011, of the Heritage Resources Coordinator as follows:

That the Committee purchase the remaining 36 Heritage Designation Plaques that are outstanding from 2006 to present.

BUDGET AND FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

Three quotes were solicited for the production of the plaques using the original specs. The lowest quote was \$220.00 per plaque including shipping and tax from Wellington Foundry in Vancouver Island, British Columbia. The total cost to purchase the 36 outstanding plaques from this company would be \$7,920.00. The PACAC Reserve balance is \$17,000 which is more than sufficient to cover this cost. Each year, PACAC

budgets \$2,000 for the purchase of plaques. Heritage Designation Plaques have not been ordered since 2006.

BACKGROUND

Each year, the PACAC commits \$2,000 of their budget for plaque production. Since 2006, this budget has not been used for Heritage Designation Plaques.
