Tipping fees could double

Public meeting Sept. 12 on plan to hike minimum landfill dumping fee to \$7 from \$5, and to \$10 in 2018

The fee to drop off garbage at the county-city dump could increase

in January. Right now the tipping fee at the Bensford Landfill is \$5. But the city and county of Peterborough are considering hiking it to \$7 in January.

That increase would be increased again in January 2018 to \$10.

Virginia Swinson, the waste diversion manager for the city, said the tipping fee has been \$5 for at least six years. That means it hasn't kept pace with inflation.

Swinson also said most Ontario municipalities charge between

\$10 and \$15 for their tipping fee.

She found only three other cities in Ontario that charge \$5: North Bay, Welland and Niagara Falls.

"We felt a modest increase to \$7 was warranted," she said.

If you want to speak up about the proposed increase, the city wants to hear from you. Send a letter to the city's public works director, Wayne Jackson, by Aug. 26.

The public is also invited to speak up at a meeting of the city-county waste management committee on Sept. 12 at City Hall on George St.

Meanwhile, Swinson also said the city's two-year-old mattress recycling program has been successful.

In 2015, the city collected 11,300 mattresses for recycling that would otherwise have gone into the landfill. It costs \$10 to recycle a mattress.

Lakefield, Norwood and Lance Wood Park at Curve Lake First Nation are all posted as unsafe following the results of tests Tuesday by Peterborough Public Health.

All other beaches in Peterborough city and county were listed as safe as of Wednesday afternoon.

Wednesday's high temperature at the Peterborough Airport was 32.2 C, feeling more like 38 C with the humidity, according to Environment Canada.
