

History of PPH

- A By-law to provide for the appointment of a Board of Health for the Town of Peterborough was passed by Peterborough Town Council on Monday, February 18, 1889.
- The City of Peterborough Department of Health was established on July 1, 1934. The first full-time Medical Officer of Health was Dr. G. Murray Fraser whose duties commenced on August 1, 1934. The original staff consisted of three persons: The Medical Officer of Health, a Sanitary Inspector, and a Secretary.
- On January 22, 1965, an agreement was signed between the County of Peterborough and the City of Peterborough to establish the Peterborough County-City Health Unit under an amalgamated board.







Public Health Mandate

"Every board of health shall superintend, provide or ensure..."

- Community sanitation and prevention/elimination of health hazards;
- Safe drinking water (small drinking water systems);
- Control of infectious diseases;
- Prevention of chronic diseases and injuries;
- "Family Health";
- Collection and analysis of data; and
- "Such additional health programs and services as are prescribed by the regulations".



What is discretionary?

- Safe Sewage Program (cost-recovery therefore no impact on the budget)
- Travel Clinic became discretionary as of January 2018 and was discontinued after a pilot to assess economic viability
- Use of infrastructure funded by Healthy Smiles Ontario to serve people in need of dental treatment

Shortfall to be made up through combination of:

- Deferred revenue
- Reserve Accounts
- Gapping



Three-Prong Strategy

Advocate for Sustained and Adequate Provincial Funding

- alPHa and OPHA
- AMO and Local Municipality Support

Judicious Use of Reserves

- Establish clear policy on minimums and use of reserves
- Identify funds available to offset deficits

Move to 30% Local Funding

 Plan for increased local share of cost-shared public health budget (from current 25% to 30% over 3 years)



Why Move to 30%

Under the **Health Protection and Promotion Act**, (1) The obligated municipalities shall pay:

- (a) the expenses incurred by or on behalf of the board of health of the health unit in the performance of its functions and duties under this or any other Act; and
- (b) the expenses incurred by or on behalf of the medical officer of health of the board of health in the performance of his or her functions and duties under this or any other Act. 1997, c. 30, Sched. D, s. 8.

And, (2) In discharging their obligations under subsection (1), the obligated municipalities in a health unit shall ensure that the amount paid is sufficient to enable the board of health to provide or ensure the provision of health programs and services in accordance with sections 5, 6 and 7, the regulations and the public health standards;
