
Housing and Homelessness Plan Steering Committee

- Chaired by City staff
- Includes 20 representatives from key sectors, community members, City and County Councils



5-year Review

- 10-year Plan implemented in 2014
- 5-year Review required by the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing (Ministry)
- City and County of Peterborough supported
- 5-year Review is complete!

\$2.5 million was dedicated to rent supplements in 2018.

20,723 issuances of Housing Stability Funds were provided between 2013-2018. This included payment of rent arrears, utility arrears, last month's rent and

758 new affordable rental units have been created in Peterborough City and County, with some still in development Rents range from 60 to 100% of average market rent.

240 households received Peterborough Renovates assistance from 2012-2018. Assistance was provided to complete necessary repairs, energy efficiency and

349 households move from homelessness to housing each year, since 2014. This is a result of collaborative work to end homelessness in the City and County of Peterhornanh


Needs Assessment

- Target includes:
 - 2,680 units Affordable Rental Housing
 - 580 Rent-Geared-to-Income (RGI) supportive units
 - 796 Affordable homeownership
