- Reporting on achievements aligned with the 20 Commitments

- 238 low income households received a municipal rent supplement
- 20 new affordable rental apartments in development (totaling 284 since 2014)
 - 499 housing starts in the City and County, with affordable housing representing 10%
- 20 low-income homeowners received help for necessary repairs, upgrades and accessibility modifications so they could stay in their homes
 - Goal of assisting 200 low and moderate income households with necessary home repairs to remain housed is 88.5% complete

- 2,844 issuances to help pay for rent and utility arrears, last month's rent and other housing costs
- 4% more shelter beds were used in 2019 than 2018.
- 7 community partners agreed to dedicate resources exclusively to the By-Name Priority List. This means people experiencing homelessness are chosen for housing based on their level of need.

- 29 people were supported by the Home for Good Supportive Housing Program.
- 61 people gave feedback on Housing and Homelessness Services through the community partner survey.
- 275 people supported to move from homelessness to housing

Targets

- End chronic homelessness by the end of 2025
- "Meet all housing needs" by 2029 by creating:
 - 580 supportive housing units for people experiencing chronic homelessness,
 2,680 new rental units, 796 new homeownership units
