The request for additional funding for Street Cleaning (\$37,100) is listed as a "Below the line" item, meaning that the item, although noted in the budget documents is not actually included in the Draft Budget. Should any Council member wish to include the item, a specific motion would be required.

The DBIA provides streetscape maintenance above the base level provided by the municipality. The service is meant to be more responsive to, and tailored to, the needs of downtown businesses. The DBIA's streetscape services are intended to complement the municipal services, not duplicate the services provided by the municipality
