Purpose

Budget and Financial Implications

Background

Armour Hill, one of seven (7) drumlin formations in the Peterborough area, is named after the land's first settler owner, Samuel Armour. In 1937, the land was purchased and donated to the City of Peterborough by the Women's Patriotic League and named Ashburnham Memorial Park (Park) in honour of those who lost their lives during the WWI.

The Park includes 12 acres, 2 acres of which are dedicated to the PMA facilities and functions. Access to the PMA, to Kaawaate Public School and to the Park is by way of Museum Drive (refer to MAAC Report19-009).

The Armour Hill Stewardship Group is a community-based, fledgling group whose goal is to promote stewardship and respect for the natural and social components of Ashburnham Memorial Park. The Group's goals are to see changes within the Park that would reduce harmful behaviours while advocating for and promoting long term stewardship and respect for the park.
