Subject: Quaker Foods City Square Operations

Report APRAC23-005

Purpose

To provide an update on the operational amenities and recreational opportunities and community events at Quaker Foods City Square.

Recommendation

That the Arenas Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee approve the recommendation outlined in Report APRAC23-005, dated March 21, 2023, of the Recreation Facility Services Manager, as follows:

Budget and Financial Implications

There are no budget or financial implications associated with the presentation.

Background

The Quaker Foods City Square, formerly referred to as Urban Park, officially opened to the public on December 17th, 2022. The seasonal ice rink operation has been a very positive new asset and operation for the City and community and has been well received by the community.

Below is a summary of some of the amenities associated with the Square and park spaces:

- Ice Rink: the seasonal skating rink is refrigerated and maintained by Arena
 Operators from December to March. Weather pending, the ice rink operation will
 commence annually in December, with a closing date of early to mid March.

 https://www.peterborough.ca/en/explore-and-play/skating.aspx. The final
 operational date is March 19, 2023 for the initial ice season.
- Water Play Feature: The west side of the square features a water play feature with associated inground water jets. This will be commissioned annually by Public Works around their seasonal outdoor water features schedule.
- Landscape features: the entire site includes various landscape features including seating furniture, seat walls, benches and greenspace for the enjoyment and use of all members of the community.
- Public Art UN Peacekeepers Monument: The City and UN Peacekeepers
 Association officially unveiled the UN Peacekeepers Monument on July 1, 2022. The
 monument is prominently displayed on the North end of the Square, directly adjacent
 to Charlotte and Aylmer St.
- **Event Power:** There is approximately 400 amps of site power that will be available for special events use, with various event power supplies located in the square area for staging and vendors.

In addition to these amenities, Recreation services plans to implement various community events and programs in the square. Examples include fitness in the park programs, children's activities and staff are working with DBIA to plan out additional special events to animate the park this spring and summer.

Special events can be requested year round utilizing the City's special event permitting process, available at https://forms.peterborough.ca/Clerks-Office/Special-Events-Application. The primary focus of permitted activities and events are to encourage community use and access to this amazing new square and its various amenities.
