## **Background**

Starting in the 2021 meeting cycle, committee meetings have been delivered virtually, and to assist with providing effective communication, divisional staff continue to provide APRAC with updates on current or upcoming projects and activities associated with the Arenas, Parks and Recreation Services for the City of Peterborough.

#### 2023 Ice/Floor Rotation

As facility user seasons shift toward spring/summer use – below is a summary of the ice and floor rotation plans for all arena facilities for 2023. Year-round ice will occur at Kinsmen Arena, with Peterborough Memorial Centre ice and floor availability pending the OHL Petes season. 2023 will see the return of the Peterborough Home Show from March 31 to April 2, 2023.

#### **HPA Freedom Mobile Pad Construction**

Construction of the replacement of the Freedom Mobile pad boards, rink floor and ice lighting as Phase One has been awarded to Schilthuis Construction Inc. Preliminary schedule has been received, with construction and demolition work beginning the week of April 4<sup>th</sup>, with scheduled substantial completion of all work planned for Friday, August 18, 2023. A further update on reopening plans for this rink will be provided closer to the substantial date. All other HPA amenities and activities (Leons Pad, Banquet Hall, Customer Service) will be operational as normal.

### Special Events - Snofest February 17 to 20, 2023

Family Day Long Weekend Winter Carnival of Events coordinated by Recreation Services Division with support from Community Services Division.

Friday, February 17th

Family Swim at the Peterborough Sport & Wellness Centre; full capacity attendance (175) with Snofest Pete, provided by Recreation Services.

Snowsuit Storytime at the Peterborough Public Library in partnership with Peterborough Museum & Archives had 16 participants.

Saturday, February 18<sup>th</sup>

Snow Much Fun Event at Quaker Foods City Square; well attended skating, facilitated play activities, facepainting, and hot chocolate with Snofest Pete. Proud partners of the Youth Council included the Peterborough DBIA and the New Canadians Centre, provided by Recreation Services, and supported by Councillor Lesley Parnell. 175 participants were engaged in activity in the square that afternoon.

The Sweater Wreath Crafternoon had 8 participants and was provided at the Peterborough Public Library in partnership with the Peterborough Museum & Archives.

Sunday, February 19<sup>th</sup>

Mayor's Pancake Breakfast; attended by 230 community members of all ages, proudly sponsored and attended by Mayor Jeff Leal, facilitated by proud partners East Peterborough Lions Club; play activities in the gymnasium and facilitated crafting for children provided. Snofest Pete engaged families in the activities and enjoyed breakfast with community members, Mayor Leal, and Councillor Lesley Parnell.

Monday February 20th

Family Day Skate at Healthy Planet Arena with both pads open and a full capacity of 312 people participating with Snofest Pete welcoming the families, supported by Recreation Services.

Alternative participation options through the weekend were provided virtually for children and youth with colouring contests, and for the community to share their "best dressed pet" photo contest. Winners were awarded gift certificates to access the programs and services at the Peterborough Sport & Wellness Centre. These virtual contests were sponsored by Recreation Services.

The Art Gallery of Peterborough offered a Snow Sculpture photo contest over the course of the weekend and awarded the winner an AGP Prize Pack.
