a) That Council, acting as Service Manager under Housing Services Act, S.O. 2011, c. 6, Sched. 1, approve the allocation and administration of Ontario Priorities Housing Initiative (OPHI) 2024/25 funding to support the restoration of six transitional housing units at 754 Water Street (Abbott House) and up to nine rent-g geared-to-income (RGI) units at 37 George Street in Havelock, Ontario (Peterborough Housing Corporation); and

b) That the Commissioner of Community Services be authorized to enter into agreements for OPHI funding with applicants and other associated agreements, on terms satisfactory to the Commissioner of Community Services and in forms acceptable to the City Solicitor.

- d) That the Conditions of Draft Plan Approval for Draft Plan of Subdivision 15T-10504 as set out in the Notice of the Director of Planning and Development Services dated February 23, 2017, and attached to Report IPGPL24-010 as Appendix H be amended as follows:
- i. That Condition No. 2 be deleted in its entirety and replaced as follows:
- “2. That if a secondary land use plan comes into effect for the subject lands prior to Final Approval, the City may amend the draft plan of subdivision, conditions of approval and Zoning By-law, as deemed necessary by Council, to implement the approved secondary land use plan to Council’s satisfaction of Council.”
- e) That Council deems the amendments made to the conditions of approval for Plans of Subdivision 15T-05503 and 15T-10504 to be minor in nature and declare that no further formal written notice of the amendments will be provided pursuant to subsection 51(47) of the Planning Act;
- f) That staff be directed to prepare, for Council’s approval, an amendment to the Official Plan to establish appropriate land use designations for Plans of Subdivision 15T-05503 and 15T-10504;
- g) That staff be directed to prepare, for Council’s approval, a strategy for financing and implementation of the development-charge eligible infrastructure works required to support Plans of Subdivision 15T-05503 and 15T-10504 by February 3, 2026;
- h) That staff be directed to prepare, for Council’s approval, a Secondary Plan for the Coldsprings Planning Area, that satisfies the Official Plan’s requirements for the Coldsprings Special Study Area;

i) That staff be directed to negotiate alternative funding arrangements with the Coldsprings development community for the completion of a City-led Coldsprings Secondary Plan;

j) That staff be directed to initiate conversation with the Township of Otonabee-South Monaghan to explore the feasibility of an employment venture in the Township utilizing City services in keeping with Township Official Plan policies, including the possibility of financial partnerships and collaborations.
