AND WHEREAS Council supports the implementation of the CPPS as a tool to streamline approvals and support housing targets under the Housing Accelerator Fund;

AND WHEREAS the proposed removal of height and angular-plane policies has raised significant public concern regarding design compatibility and the loss of clear built-form direction before the CPPS By-law is adopted;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT Council amend the recommendations of Report IPGPL25-044 as follows:

That Appendix A to Report IPGPL25-044 be approved to establish the policy framework for a city-wide Community Planning Permit System; and

That Appendix B, which proposes the removal of all building-height and angular-plane policies from the Official Plan, be referred back to staff to undertake additional analysis and public consultation on height and transition policies for each Strategic Growth Area, and report back to Council with options for consideration prior to adoption.
