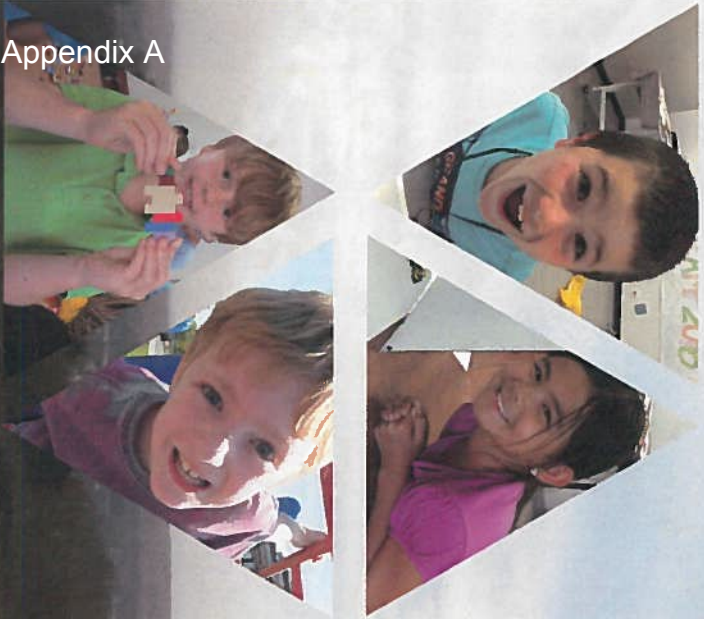

Summer Discovery Programs

LOCATION
All programs take place at the Peterborough Museum & Archives. Programs make use of two air-conditioned barrier-free modular buildings, Museum classroom, the beautiful Heritage Pavilion, the Museum's galleries and the child-friendly Museum grounds, featuring a playground equipped with swings and a play structure.
The Peterborough Museum & Archives is located in Ashburnham Memorial Park, Museum Drive, 300 Hunter St. E in Peterborough.

PROGRAM WITHDRAWAL

WHAT TO BRING

Please bring your own peanut- and nut-free snacks, refillable water bottle and lunch. Programs are both indoors and outdoors so please come prepared for the weather.

SUBSIDY

The City of Peterborough offers a Recreational Fee Subsidy Program to assist qualifying families with the cost of registration for recreational programs and camps for children under the age of 19 years. The maximum subsidy per child is \$200 per year.

PERSONAL HEALTH FORMS

Each child attending camp must complete and submit a Personal Health Form. This form will be kept on file at the Museum, and only needs to be completed once each year. The form can either be picked up at the Peterborough Museum & Archives or down- loaded from our website. Please submit health forms to the Museum prior to the first day of camp your child attends. All Museum staff have up-to-date first aid training.

July 9 - 13: "Animal Planet"

*NEW for 2018: Wildcard Wednesdays are now full day camps, which run from 9AM to 4PM

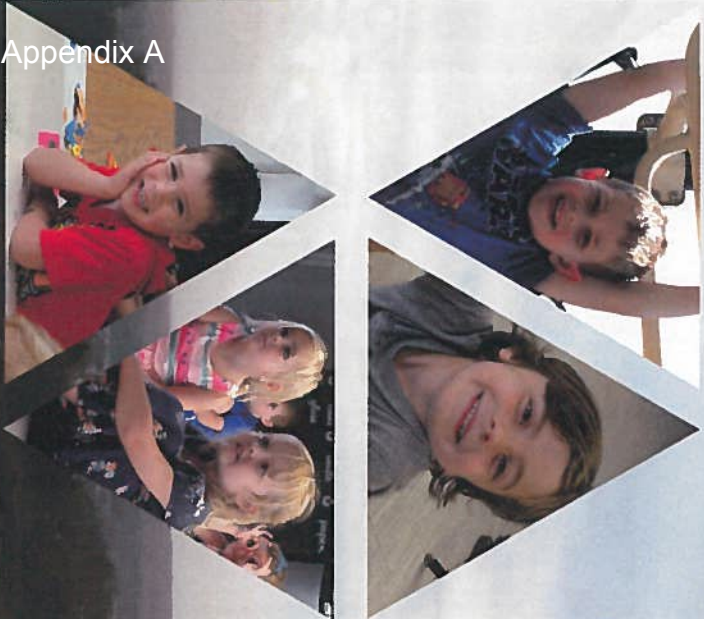
Lunch is supervised from 12PM to 1PM

July 9 – 13: The Land Before Time

July 16 – 20: The Science Club
