#### **Accessibility Reviews**

The best way to remove barriers is to prevent them. The Accessibility Office provides formal reviews during the planning and design stages of all City projects, including projects related to buildings, public spaces, services, documents, websites, by-laws, plans and policies. Recent reviews include:

- City Hall parking lot reconstruction: preliminary review of proposed concept
- Peterborough Public Library: review exiting issues related to existing doors to remain
- Peterborough Memorial Centre: review various accessibility related issues including parking, drop-off area, rest areas (benches), access to accessible seating, aisle lighting during events that require low light levels.
- Age-friendly Peterborough Plan: review baseline assessment and incorporate accessibility statistics on existing services, programs and infrastructure.

There are seven prototypes which are meant to showcase the range of ideas and ongoing work being done in the community to raise the bar on accessibility. All are based on the Phase 1 discussion and Phase 2 working group recommendations. Certified for Access is looking for your input to make sure that the prototypes evolve and come together in a way that will work for the whole community – people of all abilities and the businesses they operate and frequent.
