# **Background**

#### **Council for Persons with Disabilities**

The CPD will be represented by two members on the judging panel for the Accessible Peterborough Photo Contest, and the Accessibility and Communication Specialist will work with CPD to collaborate on the International Day of Persons with Disabilities celebration on December 3, 2016. The Accessibility and Communication Specialist was unable to attend the October 27, 2016 meeting of the Council for Persons with Disabilities (CPD).

### **Accessibility Reviews**

The best way to remove barriers is to prevent them. The Accessibility Office provides formal reviews during the planning and design stages of all City projects, including projects related to buildings, public spaces, services, documents, websites, by-laws, plans and policies. Recent reviews and research include:

- New Heritage Permit Guide: formatted document to be accessible with fillable forms
- Vision 2025: worked with consultant to format document to be accessible
- McDonnel/Gilchrist Street road reconstruction: review of road, sidewalk, trail details
- Brock Mission: accessibility review of site plan application package
- Eastgate Memorial Park: reviewed options to link amenities at adjacent Walker Park
- AOTS Community Homes, Chemong Village: consulted on accessible unit conversion
- Peterborough Arena and Pool Complex: accessibility review of conceptual design
- City Hall wayfinding signage: accessibility review of conceptual signage design
- City Hall 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor Washroom and Boardroom renovation: accessibility review
- Peterborough Public Library: accessibility review of elevator shop drawings
