Top 10 Reasons the Ubi@Duo Is Effective in the Work Enviornment



Effective and efficient communication between co-workers and supervisors

Co-workers and supervisors who do not know sign language can communicate face-to-face without an interpreter with staff members who are deaf, hard of hearing or who have communication barriers.

On-the-job training and instructions

Use the UbiDuo for impromptu training sessions that last from 5 minutes to a few hours.

Mobility in the work place

The UbiDuo is fully portable and can be carried anywhere in the workplace.

Group discussions and team meetings

The UbiDuo screen splits into 2, 3 and 4-way chat to accommodate group discussions. The UbiDuo enables a staff member to be in a work group or on a team.

Develop friendships and relationships with other staff members

Staff members who are deaf or hard of hearing have an opportunity to develop friendships using the UbiDuo. Allows discussions before, during and after work.

に Independent travel

Staff members who are deaf or hard of hearing can travel with the UbiDuo and without an interpreter.

Note taking

A "writer" can sit any where in the room during a meeting and "write" what is being said, save the notes, and print them out.


A relaxed work enviornment
