#### **PURPOSE**

# **BUDGET AND FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS**

## **BACKGROUND**

The Accessibility Advisory Committee (AAC), in accordance with the <u>Ontarians with Disabilities Act</u>, 2001 (ODA) and the <u>Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act</u> 2005 (AODA) shall advise and assist City Council and staff in promoting and facilitating City Accessibility which includes Transportation. As a result a Transportation Sub-Committee was established and the committees' role is to review municipal policies, programs and services and the identification, removal or prevention of barriers faced by people with disabilities pertaining to transportation.

On May 23, 2012 the AAC Transportation Sub-Committee held a meeting at City Hall. The following items were discussed:

- Priority and Courtesy seating roll-out is May 28<sup>th</sup>, 2012, all transit drivers are to be trained. An information pamphlet is available to the public. Priority seating is intended for people with disabilities on transit. Courtesy seating is intended for an individual who may benefit from having a seat near the front of the vehicle.
- Public Transit Operations Review Update: Draft has been completed and is now with the consultants for a final review.
- The audible signals at George Street and Sherbrooke Street have been delayed due to the curb cuts and returns not being to standard. Work is ongoing and should be completed in two weeks.
- Audible Stop Announcements: The system is working well, transit users seem to like the system. All the feedback has been positive with both the visual and the audible.

#### **Business Arising**

- The Accessibility Coordinator reviewed the difference between the new AAC
   Transportation Committee and the previous committee which fell under CPD.
   The key difference is that only City of Peterborough Transportation related issues will be discussed.
- Terms of Reference: The Terms of Reference were issued and reviewed by
  everyone prior to the meeting; one amendment is that the meetings will now be
  held at City Hall and not at Transit as documented on the Terms of Reference.
  Please note that members are required to contact either the Chair or the
  Accessibility Coordinator if they are going to be absent from a meeting, three
  consecutive absences will remove them as a committee member.
- Len Vass Councillor will continue to advocate for prioritization of snow plowing at bus stops.

#### **Transportation Update, Jim Kimble**

 Audible Stop Announcements: The system is working well, transit users seem to like the system. All the feedback has been positive with both the visual display and the audible announcements.

Volume on the buses are all set at the same decibel level, transit is fine tuning the system as some buses may be louder than others therefore the system may have to be adjusted.

Changing a bus stop with the new system is more challenging and takes longer however it is still flexible.

- "My Beat" service alerts continue to be utilized to post any changes. Transit users can also access any changes on the City of Peterborough website.
- Installation of the audible signals at George Street and Sherbrooke Street has been delayed due to the curb cuts and returns not being to standard. Work is ongoing and should be completed in two weeks.

- Pay and Display: 40 new machines were installed and the majority of the old parking meters have been removed. Heights will be lowered on the existing blue meters located at all accessible parking spots.
- Public Transit Operations Review Update: Draft has been completed and is now
  with the consultants for a final review. The next step is to post the document on
  the website for public viewing.
- Priority seating roll-out is May 28<sup>th</sup>, 2012; all transit drivers are to be trained. An
  information pamphlet is available to the public. Priority seating is intended for
  people with disabilities on transit.
- Courtesy seating roll-out is also May 28<sup>th</sup>, 2012, Courtesy seating is intended for an individual who would benefit from having a seat near the front of the vehicle, and all transit drivers are to be trained.
- Information will be provided at the Access Awareness Week from May 28 to June 2, 2012.
- Drivers will be encouraged to hand out pamphlets to transit patrons who utilize the conventional buses when the patrons are using large strollers. Public education prior to issues occurring is always a proactive approach.
