

INTRODUCTION

The Fort Erie Accessibility Advisory Committee was formed by Municipal Council of the Town of Fort Erie, pursuant to Section 11 of the *Ontarians with Disabilities Act, 2001*. The Act requires all municipalities with a population of 10,000 or more to prepare an Accessibility Plan and seek advice from an Accessibility Advisory Committee, which it establishes. The Accessibility Plan addresses the identification, removal and prevention of barriers to persons with disabilities in the municipality's By-laws and in its policies, programs, practices and services.

In 2005, the Province introduced *The Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act (AODA, 2005)*, which requires the development of standards in order to have a fully accessible Ontario by 2025. Standards have been developed for the most important areas that impact our lives:: Customer Service, Employment, Information and Communication, Transportation and the Built Environment (Design of Public Outdoor Spaces). AODA Standards require compliance by both the public and private sector.
