# Background

# AODA 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Event

In Recognition of the tenth anniversary of the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act (AODA), the Association of Municipal Managers, Clerks and Treasurers of Ontario (AMCTO) is organizing a series of events across Ontario and a one-time award, the AODA 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Champion Award. Peterborough was selected as one of nine cities across Ontario to host an event.

The Peterborough event was held on Wednesday, April 8, 2015 at the McDonnel Street Activity Centre. The AODA 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Event Working Group made a brief and well received presentation that combined information and anecdotes to provide a snapshot of accessibility advocacy and successes in Peterborough.

# AODA Training and the Accessible Peterborough Learning Series

April 2<sup>nd</sup> was World Autism Awareness Day. To increase awareness, two Ted Talk videos were circulated to staff. The first 6 minute video features 16 year old Rosie King who challenges the stereotypes of people with autism and contextualizes the issue by asking us, "Why be normal?" The second 15 minute video features geneticist Wendy Chung who shares the facts of what we currently know about autism.
