Background

AODA Training and the Accessible Peterborough Learning Series

April 2nd was World Autism Awareness Day. To increase awareness, two Ted Talk videos were circulated to staff. The first 6 minute video features 16 year old Rosie King who challenges the stereotypes of people with autism and contextualizes the issue by asking us, "Why be normal?" The second 15 minute video features geneticist Wendy Chung who shares the facts of what we currently know about autism.

Council for Persons with Disabilities

The Council for Persons with Disabilities met most recently on Thursday, May 21, 2015.

Updates were provided on plans for the 2015 Inclusion Conference – Active Together: Inclusive Sport and Physical Recreation, which was held at Fleming College from 9:45 a.m. to 4:40 p.m. on Friday May 29, 2015.

The Active Together Coordinator also provided an update on plans for the Adapted Sports Expo at Kenner Collegiate Vocational School, which was held from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on Saturday, May 30, 2015. The Active Together initiative has also begun to offer a program for local schools. The initial response has been quite positive with interest expressed for further bookings in September.

A general update about Access Awareness Week activities was also provided.

At its meeting of April 16, 2015, the Council for Persons with Disabilities approved its proposed strategic and operational plans, which outline key organizational priorities and plans for implementation of these priorities.

Accessibility Reviews: Public Spaces and Buildings

The best way to remove barriers in public spaces and buildings is to prevent them. The Accessibility Office provides formal reviews during the planning and design stages of all City projects. Recent reviews include:

- City Hall elevator refurbishment: digital panel design
- Peterborough City County Health Unit, 185 King Street
- Electronic Signage at Peterborough Memorial Centre
- Peterborough Sport and Wellness Centre, meeting room and child minding room signage
- Street closure King Street between George Street and Water Street sidewalk clearance

- PanAm Games Torch Relay reviewed route and access to Del Crary Park Stage
- King Edward Park: new washroom building

Accessibility Reviews: Information and Communication

To make information accessible to as many people as possible, the Accessibility Office recommends best practices for all City projects, documents and websites. Recent reviews include:

- Web based communication system for City of Peterborough Waste Management Division
- Ongoing consultation on draft Policy on Notice to the Public.
