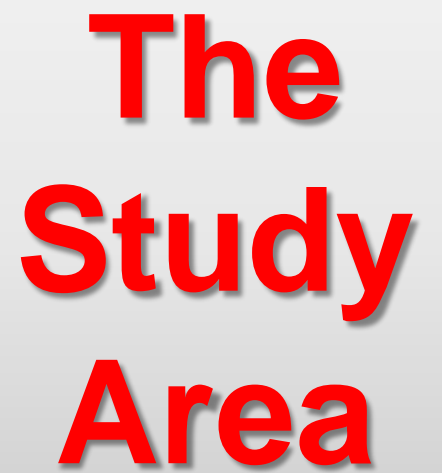


# Background

- Little Lake Master Plan process began in May 2009 and was an 18-month project
- Numerous stakeholder and community meetings were held
- Final Plan presented to City Council January 2010 with a series of recommendations for the next 20 years
- Council received the report as a guiding document for future work plan and budget initiatives







# The Existing Situation

- Consultants found that Peterborough had much to be proud of
- There is a great deal of parkland and public land around Little Lake and the Otonabee River
- Peterborough celebrated its natural and built heritage but could do more in this area
- **18 months later . . .**

# The Recommendations

- The LLMP report had broken down recommendations into two time periods:
  - Recommendations that could be addressed in the first **five years**
  - Recommendations that would take up to **20 years** to accomplish

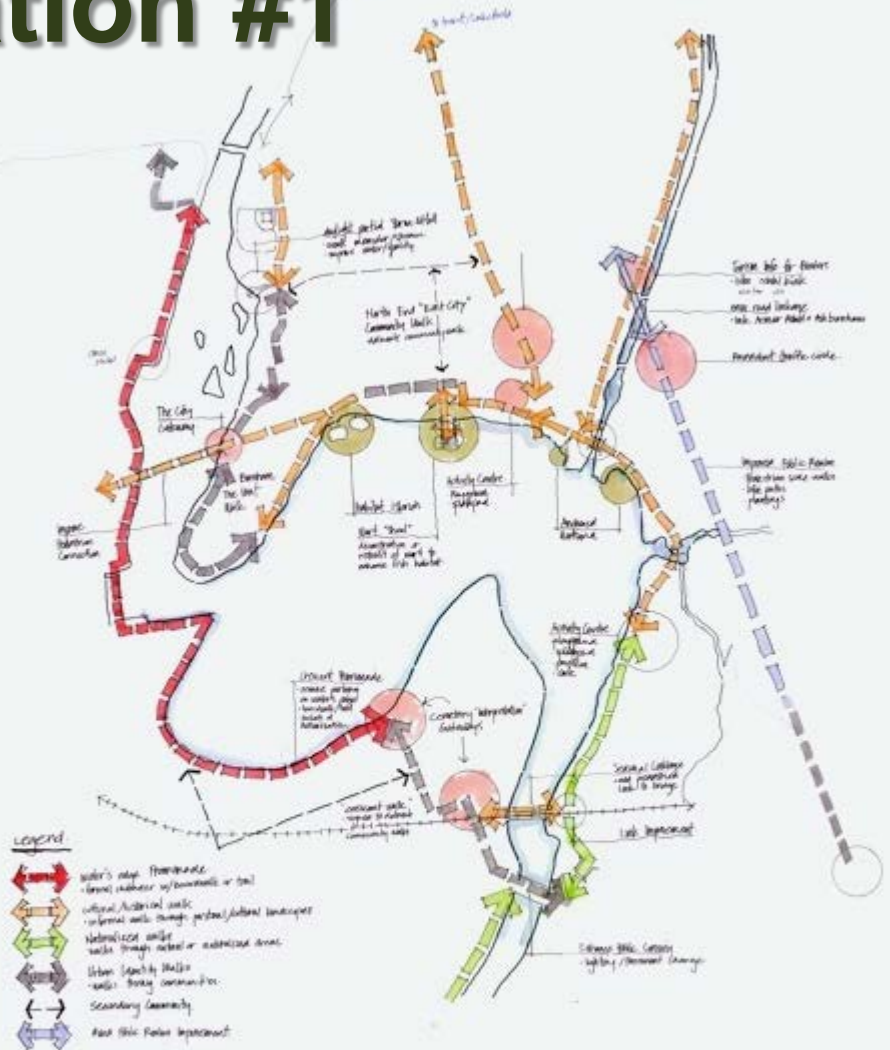

# Trail Extension

- connecting the Otonabee River Trail to Del Crary Park along Crescent Street



# Recommendation #1

## Accomplishments

- Completion of trail behind Holiday Inn
- Replacement of bridge over Jackson Creek
- Planning study to commence Fall 2012 to review Del Crary Park and Crescent Street connection





# **Recommendation #2**

## **Upgrade the Marina, Wharfs and Boat Launches**

### **Accomplishments:**

- Replaced all docks at Peterborough Marina
- Mark Street wharf removed, new boat launch and new dock installed and operational
- Upgrade made to LL Musicfest fireworks barge for safety/security
- Acquired George and Crescent wharfs from DFO
- Upgrades to George and Crescent wharfs pending

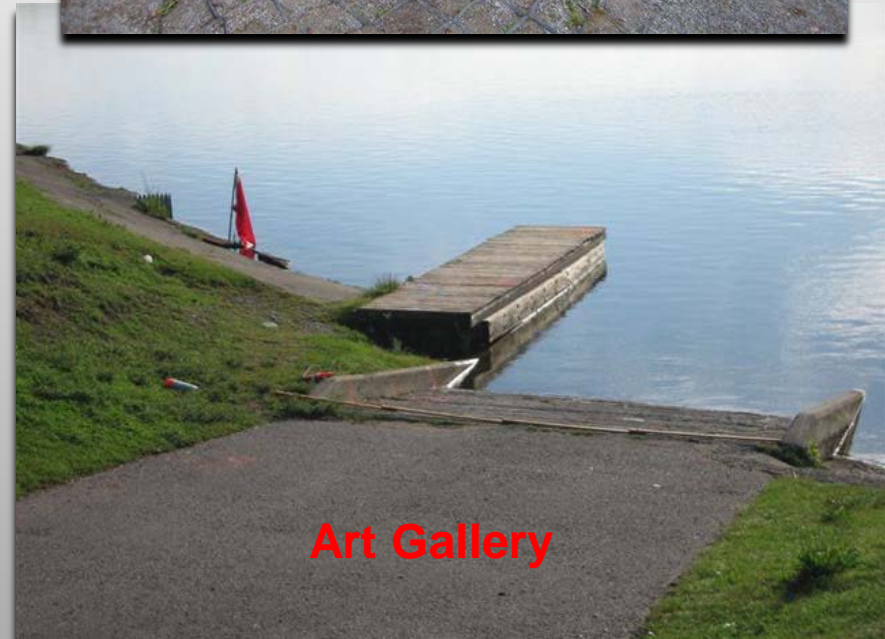

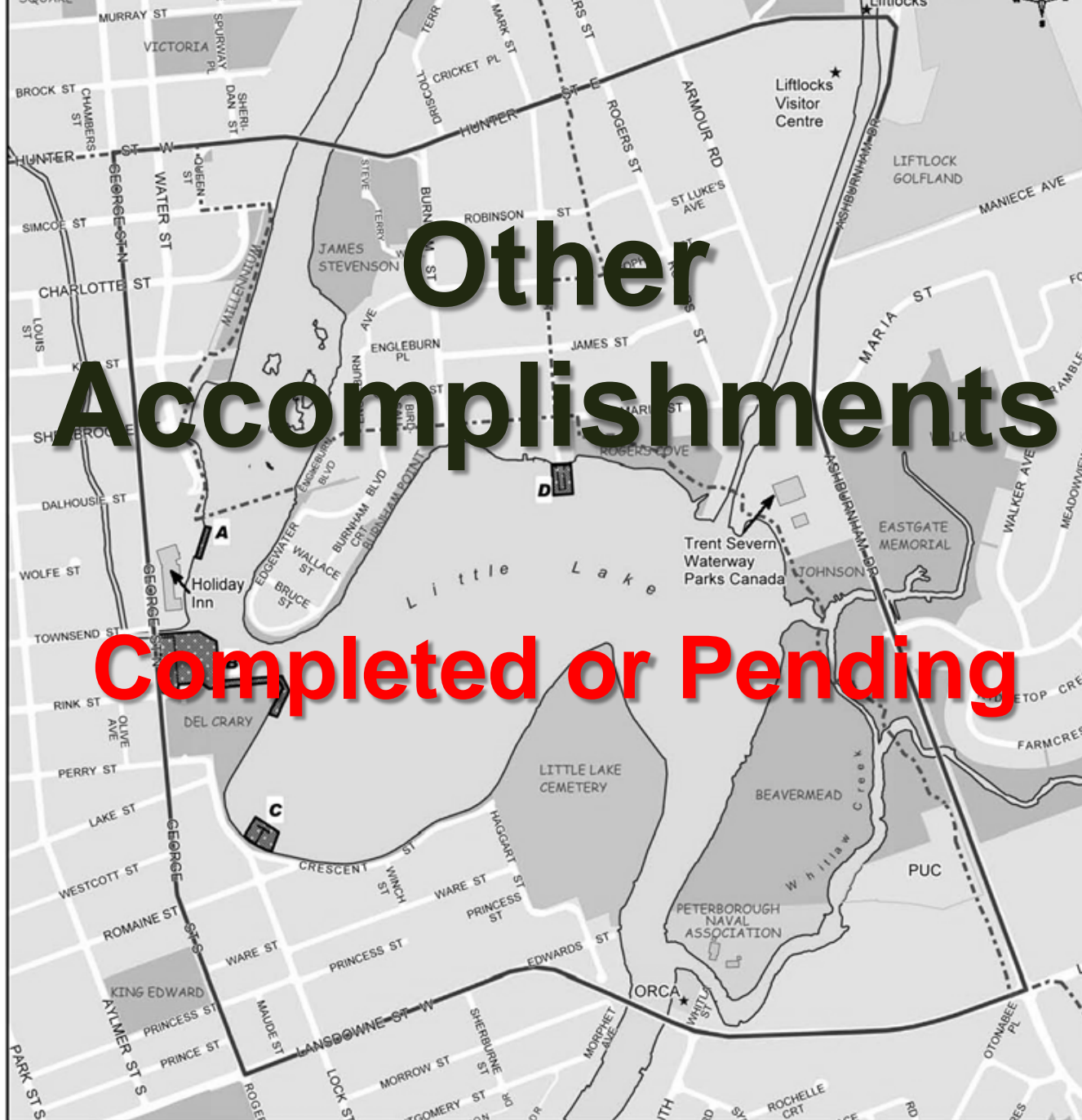

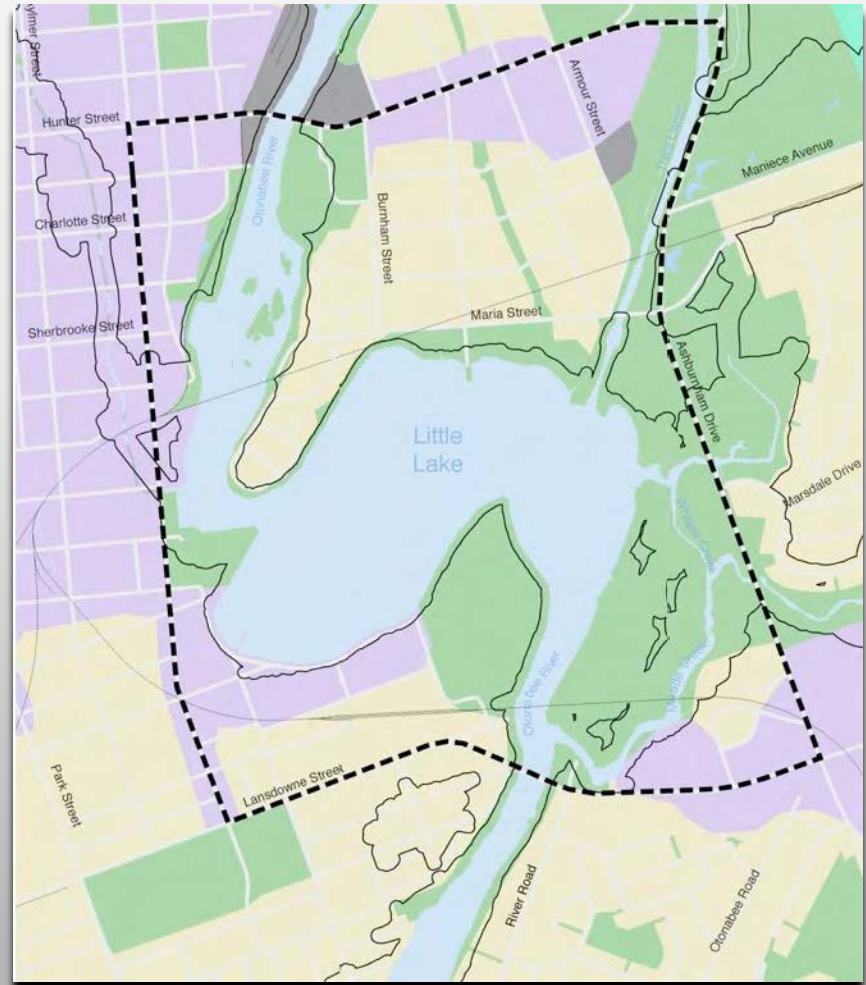

  - Committee supports work of the Master Plan

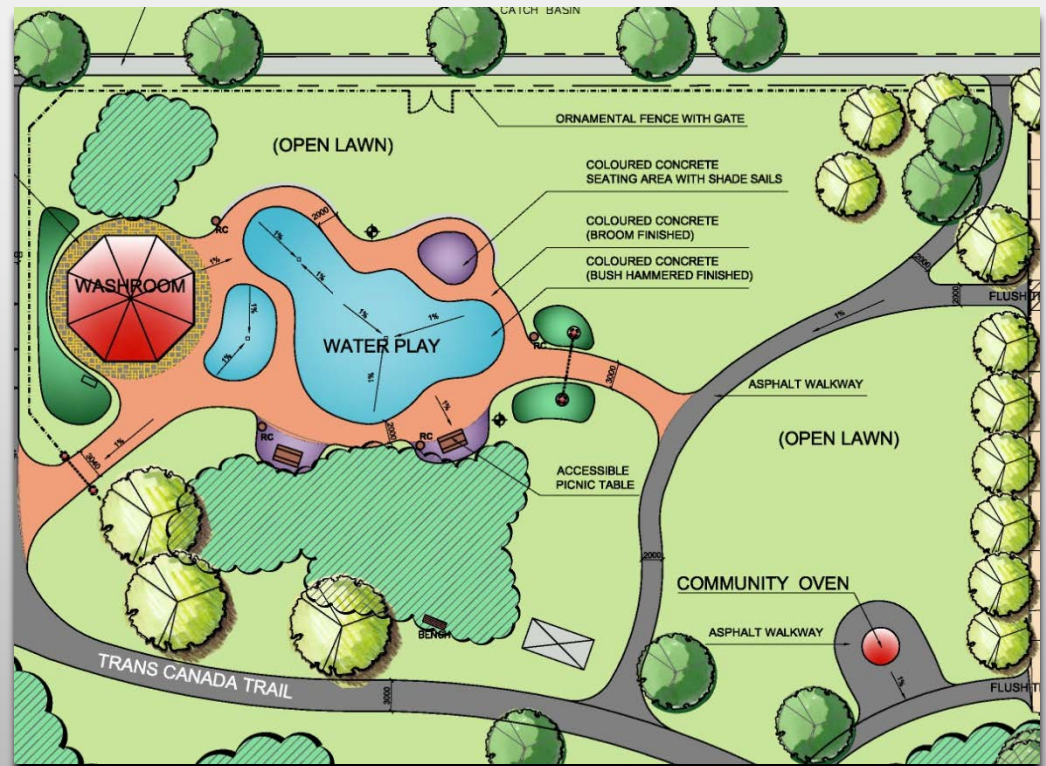




# Other Accomplishments

- **Children's Water Play Park**

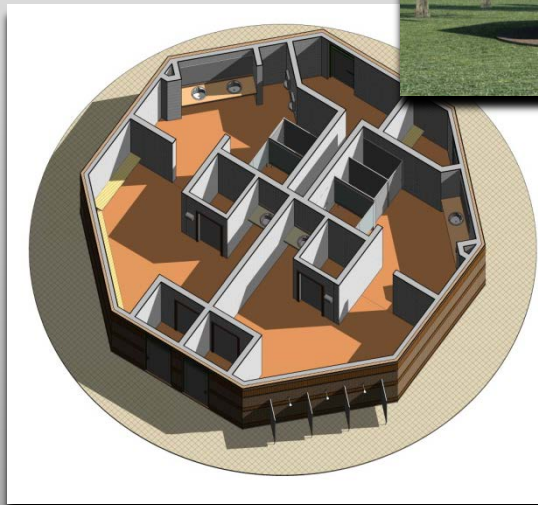
- Rogers Cove Park

- Construction complete in time for Summer 2012 opening



# Other Accomplishments

- **Replacement of Rogers Cove Washroom**

**Will take place with the Water Play Park project and completed by July 2013**



# Other Accomplishments

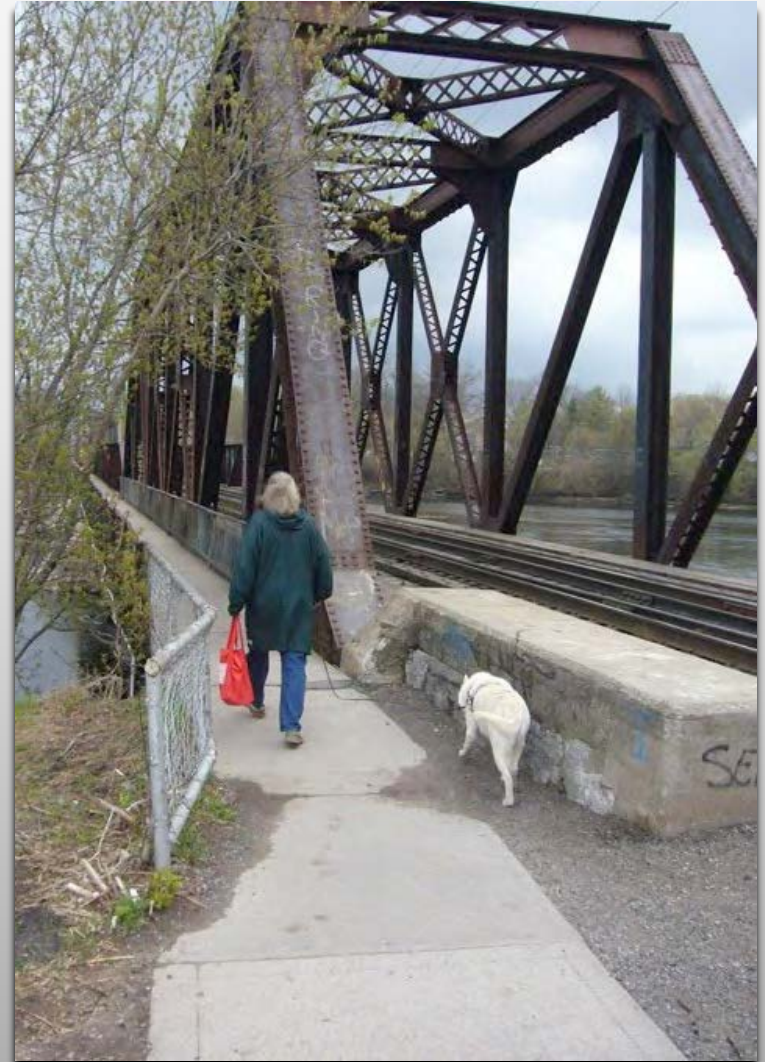
- **Relocation of Brownsea Base**
  - Is part of the Rogers Cove project and subject to funding in a 2013 capital budget request





# Other Accomplishments

- **Engineering Study for Pedestrian Crossing on Rail Bridge**
  - Study is complete and Council has approved a funding application and municipal resources to undertake this project from East City to downtown



# Other Accomplishments

## New Trail Development

- Design work is commencing for formal trail linkage from Rogers Cove to the rail bridge over the Otonabee River



# Other Accomplishments

- **Peterborough Marina**
  - Upgrades to Marina will be complete for 2013 season including new fuel pumps and greywater pumpout retrofit
  - Expansion of Marina to be considered as part of the Del Crary Park study
