Public Art Initiatives Report

Purpose

A report to update the Arts, Culture and Heritage Advisory Committee on the activities of the Public Art Initiatives Committee.

Recommendations

That the Arts, Culture and Heritage Advisory Committee (ACHAC) approve the recommendations outlined in Report ACHAC16-041, dated September 8, 2016 of the Manager, Arts, Culture and Heritage Division, as follows:

- a) That the minutes of the May 30, 2016 meeting of the Public Art Advisory Committee be received for information, and
- b) That the update on the Public Art projects for 2016 be received for information.

Budget and Financial Implications

There are sufficient funds in the 2016 Public Art Budget for the work to be completed this year.

Background

The Public Art Initiatives Committee met on May 30, 2016 to review the progress of the current public art projects. The minutes are being provided to members of the ACHAC for their information.

Via email, the Committee also approved the expenditure of funds from the Repairs & Maintenance Budget to cover the cost of a contract for a conservator to update the 2013 Public Art Inventory, evaluate the City's Public Art collection and provide recommendations and priorities for repairs and maintenance. The email from Bruce Stonehouse, Committee Chair is being provided to ACHAC for their information.

Update on 2016 Public Art Projects

2016 Hunter Street Bridge Mural Project Coordinator – Artspace City Contact – Becky Rogers Client – City of Peterborough

Jill Stanton, the artist selected for the 2016 project in the second arch of the Hunter Street Bridge began work on the mural at the beginning of August. Ms Stanton is a Canadian artist who uses the language of comics and graphic narrative to examine themes of dreams, nature, technology and the future. Her work spans various scales—from smaller drawings in graphic novels and comic books, to exploring pattern and environment in large-scale murals and transitory public pieces.

The project was launched on August 8, 2016 at a media event held at Flavour. Ms Stanton gave an artist talk August 24, at 6:30 pm at Hunter Street Bridge. The Official Opening took place on September 1, 2016 from 6 - 8pm under the arch.

The inaugural downtown mural site is the east-facing facade of HELP Paralegal — a flat roofed, one story building of cement block construction. It is located on the South East corner of Simcoe and Queen Streets close to the Provincial Court House. Alex Bierk is the artist selected for this project.

The proposed mural for the Downtown Mural Project Site will consist of large-scale black and white imagery (or an image) of clouds. The project offers an artistic aesthetic paired with technically state of the art visuals and material that will not damage the surface of the building in any way, and can be installed by the Project's September deadline. Subject matter will speak to both the vulnerability and beauty that Mr Bierk sees here, pointing to the ambiguous nature of the site itself and a future that he is deeply invested in.

The original intent was for the mural to be rendered and installed with a rough surface UV print application as recently used for the massive outdoor brick wall at the Museum of Contemporary Canadian Art (Toronto), as part of the Contact Photography festival, as well as a 10,000 sq. foot mural at the ROM. Unfortunately, the surface of the building itself precluded this approach. The mural will now be installed using aluminum panels. The Official Opening will take place September 23, 2016 as part of Artsweek.
