Purpose

A report to advise the ACHAC on the monthly activities of the Heritage Preservation Office (HPO) for June, July and August, 2017.

Background

Update on Cenotaph

The masonry on the Cenotaph was inspected this summer and it was determined that the large granite slabs are stable and that repointing is sufficient at this time. An RFP is being drafted seeking quotes for the work which will be undertaken this fall.

Urban Park/UN Peacekeeping Monument

Preliminary work has begun on the Urban Park and the UN peacekeeping Monument is in its final stages of detail design. The local chapter of the Canadian Association of Veterans in UN Peacekeeping is undertaking a fundraising campaign in support of construction of the monument. Installation of the monument is scheduled for late 2018.

Little Lake Cemetery Mapping Update

Students from the Fleming College GIS Program updated the little Lake Cemetery online map as a culminating project. The team of three students corrected errors in plot locations and inaccuracies in the information on each marker. They also identified a number of markers that had been missed in the initial project in 2007.

Walking Tour App

Staff met over the summer to discuss the technical requirements for the walking tour app. The City's Geomatics Division is researching how the ESRI mapping system can be modified to create the type of walking tour that the Heritage Committee envisioned as the commemoration of Martha Kidd. The Arts, Culture and Heritage Division has requested funding in 2018 from the City's Technical Services Division to support the project as well. EC3 has indicated that they are stepping back from their project to create a similar mapping system for the arts. The City has a desire to see tours centered on art developed as a corollary to the heritage tours. A staff committee has been formed to move the technological side of the project forward.
