2010 Budget: \$51,500

Comments: A change room and washroom facility is required to service visitors to Milroy Park. Funding for the facility is recommended from Development Charges. In 2008, the City added approximately 2 hectares of parkland in the Waverley Heights subdivision. The Developer will complete basic improvements through the subdivision agreement. Full development of the park will be staged over the next several years as set out in the budget and recommended to be funded from Development Charges.

New Public Works Yard

2010 Budget: \$550,000 Total Budget: \$20,625,000

Comments: The 2007 Strategic Business Plan for Public Works identified several deficiencies with the current Public Works Yard, including: it is too small to accommodate the activities being carried out at this site, the parking is inadequate, the site drains through the storm water system directly into Little Lake, and the existing Fleet Services facility is inadequate for the servicing of Clients Groups totaling 568 fleet units. Re-commissioning the Townsend Street Site conforms to the Downtown Revitalization Plan, but the future use of this building has not yet been determined.

There will also be investigation in 2010 into the condition of other parking lots, some of which may be recommended for reconstruction in 2011.

Comments: Each year existing trails and bike lanes will be identified based on a condition rating and work programs will be set as funding permits. In 2010 Transportation Division staff will focus on upgrading the Rotary Trail crossing at Nassau Mills Road and a new trail crossing at Parkhill Road near Ravenwood Drive. It has been recommended that the budgeted allocation of funds be increased by 3% each year.

Comments: The Transportation Plan outlines transportation demand management measures to be implemented by 2021. Central Area Master Plan Implementation Phase

The Central Area Master Plan identified 22 strategies to promote the ongoing health and vitality of the Central Area. Recommended activities for 2010 include: the preparation of neighbourhood plans for Central Area Neighbourhoods; the preparation of an urban design program to celebrate the Gateways to Downtown; the preparation of an urban design study for a public square, multipurpose outdoor venue for gatherings and community celebrations; and the preparation of a feasibility study for a municipal cultural facility in support of the "Downtown First" philosophy for municipal investment in cultural facilities.

Official Plan Review – Implementation Phase

\$182,500

In 2009, the City completed the required Official Plan Amendment to comply with the Growth Plan fro the Greater Golden Horseshoe and a comprehensive consultation program intended to provide a forum for a constructive evaluation of the City's Official Plan. Through that process City staff, commenting agencies, and the community at large identified many areas of policy reform. Planned strategies for 2010 include the implementation of a Community Improvement Plan for Schedule H, which includes the Downtown, Old West End, and East City.

Affordable Housing Capital Strategy

Comments: The purpose of this strategy is to stimulate investment (from both for-profits and not-for-profits) in affordable housing projects. As part of the federal and provincial economic stimulus plans the Affordable Housing Program has been renewed through 2010. Projects have included: seed funding for the Peterborough Affordable Housing Foundation; the Affordable Housing Property Reserve — a dedicated fund the lever the acquisition of land for affordable housing development; the Affordable Housing Partnership Fund — a program to underwrite development charges for new affordable housing units; and the Daniel Building Pilot Project.

Accessibility Improvements

Accessibility Improvements at various City owned or operated facilities

2010 Budget: \$90,000

Comments: Legislation that came into effect in 2005 requires that Ontario be barrier-free by 2025. The Council for Persons with Disabilities administers the Access Fund. Its goal is to insure that there is barrier-free access to all City owned and operated facilities. Buildings that have received money from the Access Fund include Market Hall and Peterborough Museum & Archives.
